10-18-4277 <u>DISCUSSION/INFORMATION ITEMS</u>

Trent Provo – COVID update. A few weeks ago I added a COVID dashboard to the school's website. The good news is that our number of cases keep going down, and our quarantines keep going down. Since we started masking in September we went from 15 cases per week to 2 positive cases last week. We went down from 117 quarantines to 0 last week. Even our number of kids be sent home with COVID symptoms keeps going down. Our goal is to keep as many kids as possible in school. The Governor did extend his executive order to the end of October. This allows us to keep utilizing the three-foot rule to quarantine as long as we stay masked. My recommendation now is to continue to keep masked. I think we are heading in the correct direction. Hopefully we can get back to mask optional soon.

We can revisit that at our November meeting. I am not guaranteeing anything. I am always cautious after breaks when people have been travelling. This is when you can see spikes in the COVID numbers.

Martha Marmouze – I want to stay pro-active with the masks. We can revisit it in November. I feel it is important.

Heather Hudson – I think when you are sitting on this side, you have to look at things differently. You have to examine things from a different point of view. I hear you, but there are other community members as well. We are trying our best to represent everyone. There are a lot of laws and regulations over a public state school. We have a lot of other things to be considered. It is not easy, but we do care. We are carefully considering what happens.

Ron Childress – I know some of our community disagree completely with the idea that kids wearing masks in school is taking away parent choice and private rights. I am not here to debate the effectiveness or ineffectiveness of wearing masks to protect against the virus. I have said in the past there are "experts" on both sides of the aisle and we can debate this topic until the cows come home. This is not my intention nor my desire.

In closely following activity at Eastern Greene schools, the positive cases and quarantine numbers that are facts and not opinions. My overall intention of having kids being able to remain in school and incur fewer quarantine situations, is definitely supported by the wearing of masks. Based on the rules defined by the Governor on quarantines, masking vs. non-masking has allowed the number of kids required to be quarantined to drop very significantly over the weeks since September 8, 2021. If you look at the numbers, we have had almost 400 kids out prior to the masking. We have had a lot less since then, even 0 as of last week. As I stated previously, providing classroom in-person learning for students and in general being able to be around friends and others who care for them is very important to me.

By asking your children to wear masks, I believe they are contributing to the success of keeping our quarantine rates very low. I ask that those who are seeking to continue their request to remove masks, to look no further than the students who rely on being in school for so much more than classroom time, as those are the students who will suffer the most from extensive quarantines if we return to previous quarantine rules.

Mike Adams – I stand where I stand. I don't know if we can statistically say whether masks help or they hurt. We don't know where we would have been if we didn't wear masks. It could have been the same. Historically that is basically what some of the experts are saying.

Matt Roberts - I would like to congratulate to the girls' cross country team for advancing to regional as well as Will Valentine and Lillian Blaze for advancing to semi-state.
